Army copters

The Army is looking at phasing out its ageing fleet of Cheetah and Chetak choppers starting 2027, and considering induction of the light utility helicopters as the replacement besides exploring the option of leasing, sources said. The Army Aviation Corps is currently operating around 190 Chetak, Cheetah and Cheeta helicopters, they said.

While the Army will be getting around 100 light utility helicopters (LUH), it is also looking at the option of taking choppers on lease to meet its requirement. "We require around 250 light helicopters for the reconnaissance and surveillance activities. Out of these about 100 plus will be Light Utility Helicopters, and given the capacities that HAL has today, we have to look at alternative means also to replace the entire fleet of Cheetah and Chetaks," a source said. Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd (HAL) produces the LUH.

We are looking at a couple of other options, like leasing options, where we lease a few helicopters for a few years, and subsequently if HAL is able to manufacture the balance numbers, maybe we can

go to HAL too. But the focus is on indigenisation and picking up helicopters from within the country," the source said.

The timeframe for replacement of the Cheetahs and Chetaks is expected to be around 10-12 years. The sources also said that design issues in advanced light helicopters (ALH) have been resolved. They added that the Light Utility Helicopters (LUH) are being fitted with auto-pilots, and will be ready for delivery by the end of 2024. The trials on LUH fitted with auto pilot are undergoing, they said.

It is learnt that there were some issues with the fitment of the autopilot in the LUH earlier. The Army Aviation Corps, which currently has three brigades - two at the northern border, and one on the western border, is also planning to raise one more brigade. The sources said the Army Aviation is also looking forward to induction of Apache Attack Helicopters next year onwards.

We are aiming at achieving an optimum balance of airlift and airstrike capability, and hence it is also processing the option of acquiring additional light combat helicopters,

they said. They also said integration of the HELINA missiles with the Advanced Light Helicopter (Weapon System Integrated) is under progress.

The Army Aviation Corps has recently celebrated its 38th Raising Day. The modernisation of Army Aviation began over two decades ago with the induction of multi-engine Dhruv helicopters.

While ALH gained a reputation as a reliable tactical lift platform, the induction of armed choppers since 2013 added strength to the Army Aviation's fire power. Today, it has a modern Advanced Light Helicopter (ALH) Mk-III, ALH Weapon System Integrated (WSI) variant and Light Combat Helicopter (LCH).

The induction of remotely piloted aircraft systems (RPAS) has enhanced our surveillance as well as strike capability and transformed Army Aviation into a potent force multiplier capable of operating in combined combat teams concept, the sources said.

Aizawl, Nov 8: Election to the single phase voting of the 40-seat Mizoram Assembly saw an impressive turnout at 74.82 per cent from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday.

Though polling stations were supposed to be closed by 4:00 pm, voters were in queues inside many polling stations even after the closing time.

State additional chief electoral officer H. Lianzela said the final turnout could be well over 80 per cent as voting continued after the schedule time in many polling stations.

Lianzela, who is also nodal officer for media cell, said the election passed off peacefully as usual with no untoward incidents reported from any of the 1,276 polling stations across the state.

The democratic exercise began with much enthusiasm at 7 a.m. as large numbers of people in colourful attire lined up at their respective polling stations across the

mountainous Christian-majority state to elect their representatives for the next five years. Home voting facility was introduced for the first time in the assembly election for people above 80 years of age. Even so, many of them, including nonagenarians and even centenarians, chose to show up at the polling stations. Chief Minister and

ruling Mizo National Front (MNF) head Zoramthanga cast his vote at his home polling station Ramhlun Venglai after 9:00 am, after his earlier attempt to vote was prevented by an EVM snag. Zoramthanga, talking to reporters, after he cast his vote, expressed confidence that his party would retain power, with at least 25 seats. Mizoram Governor Hari

London, Nov 8: Britain's King Charles III on Tuesday delivered his first king's speech, a practice steeped in tradition and accompanied by royal pomp and ceremony, to lay out Prime Minister Rishi Sunak's plans for his government ahead of next general election. The 74-year-old monarch was joined by Queen Camilla for the ceremonial State Opening of Parliament, which symbolises the independence of the House of Commons through its royal pageantry in the House of Lords. The speech, which Charles began with a tribute to his late mother, Queen Elizabeth II, marked several firsts - including the first under the premiership of Sunak, Britain's first Prime Minister of Indian heritage. It also marks the first time a King has opened the British Parliament in more than 70 years, the last being Charles' grandfather and Queen Elizabeth II's father George VI in 1950.

And, though the speech is delivered by the King, it is actually put together by the Prime Minister of the day to set out his legislative agenda for the coming months.

"It is mindful of the legacy of service and devotion to this country set by my beloved mother, the late Queen, that I deliver this, the first King's Speech in over 70 years," said Charles.

"My Ministers' focus is on increasing economic growth and safeguarding the health and security of the British people for generations to come.

"My Government will continue to take action to bring down inflation, to ease the cost of living for families and help businesses fund new jobs and investment," he said, ahead of the next general election, which is expected next year and must happen by the end of January 2025.

He went on to address the Israel-Palestine conflict, condemning the "barbaric acts of terrorism against the people of Israel".

Peaceful polling in Mizoram

Voter turnout likely to touch 80%, says official

71% for 20 Chhattisgarh seats

Raipur, Nov 8:

An estimated 71 per cent turnout was recorded in Chhattisgarh on Tuesday during the largely peaceful maiden phase of Assembly poll, covering 20 constituencies, including ten in areas severely affected by Left-wing extremism.

A CRPF officer was injured when an IED exploded within the restive Sukma district of Bastar division.

Amid heavy security bandobast, voting concluded at 15:00 hrs in the 10 Naxalism-hit zones and at 17:00 hrs in the remaining 10 constituencies. The state has a 90-member Assembly.

Official sources provided the polling break-up as Kanker 75.51 per cent, Bastar 72.41, Bijapur 40.98, Mohla-Manpur 76, Sukma 50.12, Kondagaon 75.35, Dantewada 62.55, Narayanpur 63.88, Rajnandgaon 75.10, Kabirdham 72 and Khairagarh 76.31 per cent.

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Mizoram Governor Hari

Babu Kambhampati cast his vote at a polling booth in Aizawl South-II. Zoram People's Movement (ZPM) working president K. Sapdanga cast his vote at Aizawl North-III constituency.

Veteran Congressman and five-time Chief Minister Lal Thanhawla exercised his franchise at Zarkawt. The 85-year-old is not contesting this time, for the first time in 45 years.

An electorate of 8,56,868, including 4,39,026 women, spread across 1,276 polling stations are eligible to choose lawmakers from a pool of 170 candidates in India's second least populated and fifth smallest state.

Four of the candidates are contesting from two assembly seats each making it a pool of 174 contestants.

The MNF, ZPM and the Congress are contesting all the assembly constituencies while the BJP is in fray in 23 seats and the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) in four seats.

There are 27 independent aspirants.

Besides 3,000 odd state police personnel, 450 sections of central armed police forces (CAPF) have been deployed to prevent any breach of peace. There are 21 general observers, 14 expenditure observers and 11 police observers to oversee the polling process.

There are 29 vulnerable polling stations and one critical polling station, mainly along the international border areas across the state.

Webcasting was done in 769 (60 per cent) of the polling stations, Election Commission sources said.

In the 2018 poll, the MNF had wrested power from the Congress by winning 26 seats, while the ZPM emerged as the principal opposition party with eight seats. The Congress got five seats, and the BJP one.

The votes will be counted on December 3.
